Our Ramadan Program addresses three issues: food security, malnutrition, and the mental well-being of families living under the poverty line. Our work prioritizes children and women who are the most vulnerable.

In a world where 16,000 children die every day due to hunger related illness, your Zakat and Zakat Al Fitr donations provide food baskets and bring smiles on the faces of families in need.

## EID GIFTS FOR ORPHANS

Eid gifts for orphans - Alhamdullilah with your generous support we also distributed \$25 Eid cash gift to 400 orphans in Somalia, Bangladesh, Yemen, and Lebanon.

Locally we held Eid toy drives in different cities to gift toys to 1,000 children living in poor neighbourhoods.





# QURBANI

Our Qurbani/Zabiha Program provides a means for Muslims around the world to fulfill their religious obligation of donating their annual sacrifice of meat to vulnerable families around the world.

This Qurbani is a source of sustenance for families who would otherwise not be able to afford meat, a high priced commodity in many communities.

# C O V I D R E S P O N S E

The COVID-19 Pandemic has created an unprecedented crisis situation across the globe. Millions of lives have been affected in different ways. Many have lost their jobs and are having a hard time putting food on the table for their families, while thousands are in need of basic equipment, like masks and sanitizers, to protect themselves from the virus.

We initiated a COVID Response Program to try and help families touched by the crisis in one way or another. As a quick response, we distributed food baskets and hygiene kits in 11 countries, including Canada. We targeted beneficiaries who were disabled, single mothers, people living in poverty, and/or those who were ill.

Countries: Canada, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Palestine (Gaza), India, Pakistan, Somalia, Syria, Yemen, Lebanon





# WATER

As of 2019, 1 in 3 people lack access to clean drinking water while over half of the global population lacks safe sanitation. HCI has collaborated with NGO's and beneficiaries on the ground to implement projects that provide access to safe and clean water, one of the most effective instruments in promoting health and reducing poverty.

Countries: Afghanistan, Burundi, Bangladesh, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Ghana, India, Kenya, Pakistan, Somalia, Yemen

Type of projects: Wells, Latrines, Pumps, Desalination Units.

# HEALTH

We recognize that millions of people across the world today are dying from preventable causes, especially children, and women who have pregnancy related issues. Our solution to sustainability is to run mobile health clinics in communities where there is a lack of access to medical facilities, and support establishments that are providing health services to low-income families.

Countries: Pakistan, India, Rohingya, Somalia, Bosnia, Syria

Type of projects: Eye cataract surgeries, free medical treatment, psychological support, equipment for hospitals, COVID treatment

# EDUCATION

We recognize that poverty is a key barrier to accessing education for children and adults, especially women and girls. A lack of resources unfortunately means that families need to make difficult decisions. Often this means they cannot afford to send their children to school. Our education programming makes it possible for children to attend school, and learn in a safe and secure environment.

Countries: Pakistan, India, Rohingya, Bangladesh, Somalia, Burundi

Type of projects: Scholarships, vocational training, construction of classrooms, school supplies, transportation from rural villages, healthy meals

# EMERGENCY RELIEF

Our Emergency Relief Program is designed to provide immediate relief to victims of humanitarian disasters. We closely monitor global crises and disaster trends to prepare and rapidly respond to provide aid.

Emergencies responded to: Delhi violence in India, Cyclone Amphan in India and Bangladesh, Assam floods in India, Lebanon blast, Karachi floods, Sudan floods, Gaza attack

Types of projects: Food and non-food items, medical assistance, reconstruction of homes, rebuilding of infrastructure.

# WINTER RELIEF

# CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

There are millions of children around the world who are engaged in child labor and under go child abuse. They are exploited due to issues of poverty and inequality.

Our Child Sponsorship Program (CSP) supports the livelihoods of these orphans and children in need. Our program ensures that school aged children living in poverty and in conflict zones have access to basic necessities (food, water, shelter clothing), as well as an opportunity to attend school.

Countries: Afghanistan, India, Bangladesh, Rohingya, Somalia, Pakistan and Kashmir, Guyana, Palestine, Syria, Lebanon, Tunisia





# A B D U L'S S T O R Y

This is Abdul Gaffar Abdul Samad with his daughter. He lives in Makraniphali, Nandurbar, Maharashtra, India. He has 2 daughters and one son.

He earns his daily income by ironing clothes for people in the village, but has not been able to work due to the COVID lockdown. He finds it extremely difficult to feed his family. His family was a recipient of the food baskets we distributed in India during Ramadan. Thanks to your donation, he will be able to feed his children nutritious and healthy food.

He wanted us to convey his thanks to all of you, and made Dua for all our donors.

# AMIN'S STORY

This is Amin Ahmed. Amin was a porter working in Al-Hodaidah. Last year, the dire circumstances forced him to move to Sanna with his family (mother, 3 children, a widow sister and her daughter). The conflict in Yemen has made life difficult for him. Today he is struggling to provide his family with basic necessities. He spends his day looking for labor job opportunities, and although he works very hard, he does not make enough to fulfill the needs of his family.

These were Amin's words when he received the Qurbani meat: "These days, living conditions are very bad and difficult. It is hard to meet the basic needs of my family. With the rising prices of food, clothing, and basic necessities, it has become more difficult to provide for my children. Most of the time, I don't have enough money. I borrow from neighbors, and it is difficult for me to pay back my debts. To survive these days, I rely on humanitarian assistance. My family and I are thankful for HCI and it's donors to give the chance to enjoy a decent meal during these uncertain times."





## MOHAMMED'S STORY

This is a family of four that was adversely affected by COVID. Our relief program gave the family a source of hope for survival. Mohammed, the father, had these words for you:

"My name is Mohammed, I am a father of three children. My family and I moved to Sana'a seeking safety and trying to find work. Due to COVID19 lockdown I lost my job and I am not able to even pay the rent of my house. This food basket helped me and my family during these difficult and uncertain times. Thank you HCI and the donors for your help and support."

# FIKADU DEMOZ'S STORY

Fikadu Demoz (above), a resident of the Ksad Dalwo Village, is helping her children drink clean and fresh water drawn from the new water point.

Previously, Fikadu was walking 3-4 km each day to collect water from a nearby river, which then had to be boiled before consumption. "I was always rushing. Always getting water and trying to get the food cooked. It took up so much of my time, there was no time for other things. I hardly saw my own sister Genait, and I had to bring my son with me to get the water every day. He gets very tired and he wants to stop and play often but we did not have time" says Fikadu. She went on to express, "Sometimes I was so busy I had to send my daughter to get the water and then she would miss some of school. Now the water point is just a short walk from my compound, and I meet my sister there every day. Our children play together, and I hear all the funny stories from our village. We laugh a lot when we are together!"





# HAFIDA'S STORY

This is Hafida Bourich and her sons. She lives in the slums of Rabat. She is a widow and stay at home mom.

She receives a monthly food basket from HCI to help her support her family, and her sons receive school supplies to help them with their education. We found out that her house has broken windows and doors, and during winter, the roof is not able to hold snow and water. As a result, her house becomes wet and the washroom get flooded. We installed a new roof, new windows and doors, and built a new washroom for her family. We also fixed the electricity wires that were dangling from the walls. Hafida wants to express her gratitude to your generosity and for keeping her and her sons warm during this winter.








